SUMMARY

Intervention and Psychological Treatment is a core subject of basic training for Degree in Psychology, third year. The student will have the opportunity to acquire basic knowledge, along with other subjects such as Psychology, Social and Community Intervention, also taught in third grade, Psychological Assessment, the second year, and Design Research in Psychology and Psychopathology, to be taught in fourth grade. That training will provide a solid foundation for the development of further training in other Grade electives such as Clinical Psychology, Clinical Child Psychology, Intervention in Educational Contexts, and the external practice training. Also, this course brings its own set of skills essential for professional development in the field of Clinical Psychology and Health, as well as other areas of professional intervention

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The use of mobile devices, tablets and laptops will be at the disposal of the teaching methodology proposed by each teacher.

EVALUATION

Following the regulations of the University of Valencia, approved by the Governing Council on May 30, 2017 (ACGUV 01.08 / 2017), the student's global assessment can be obtained as the result of a combination of the assessment obtained in the final test along with that achieved in the different continuous assessment activities carried out. These activities can be practical and carried out in class or individually, reading texts and preparing reports on the matter, joint or individual work with their corresponding reports, presentations of the work in class, etc.

The assessment will be carried out continuously throughout the course through various activities (academic work, readings, case resolution proposals, practical, written and audiovisual material produced by students, practical exercises, etc.) and a final written test (of alternatives or resolution of practical cases), carried out in the two official calls of the UV.

In order to pass the subject, a 5 out of 10 in the exam must be obtained in the official calls.

The final test of the subject will have a weight between 30-70% of the grade. And the part of the activities will have a weight of between 30-70% of the grade.

There are no differences between the first and second calls regarding the evaluation methodology.

Optionally, the professor in charge of the subject may propose an assessment test for the first semester. The evaluation of the content of the first semester will mean 40% of the final grade, and the evaluation of the second semester 60%.

The professor responsible for the subject will state in the Agenda of said subject, and at the beginning of the course, how the evaluation of the theoretical matter and the practical activities will be organized, as well as the weight and weighting that he considers most appropriate in relation to to its organization of the syllabus of the subject.

The qualification of the subject will be subject to the provisions of the Regulation of Evaluation and Qualification of the University of Valencia for Bachelor's and Master's degrees (ACGUV 108/2017 of May 30, 2017). http://www.uv.es/graus/normatives/2017_108_reglament_avaluacio_qualificacio.pdfThe final grade and the granting of an honors degree will be based, in addition to theexam grades, individual and group assignments, activities, attendance and participation in class, as well as attendance at tutorials.
