SUMMARY

The television report is a subject of theoretical and practical covering ideation, planning and development process of creating the genre of reportage on television. Taking as a starting point selected by each working group, topic aims to develop an audiovisual sample according to the following guidelines: Envisioning and topic selection, documentation, preparation of plan of production and filming, design realization and postproduction. In parallel, from the point of view of audiovisual languages will deepen in the use and management of the basic concepts of realization, planning and staging the digital editing process.

Naturally, the development of the subject involves the use of i Communication Technologies (ICTs), particularly those related to capturing video and audio, editing and postproduction. Moreover, it also involves the use of the Internet in its various applications. TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Given the pre-eminently practical, class attendance is mandatory. In them, the teacher will provide guidelines to develop paragraphs that the agenda include and provide materials, both textual and technology, students need at all times for the successful completion of projects. In that sense, the teacher will perform a constant and personalized monitoring of each project, as a tutorial, a task counseling and ongoing review. All this will be supported by a specific bibliographic selection that will be available to the student at the beginning of the course, in addition, more extensive, general literature accompanying the agenda. viewing audiovisual materials as examples will also be suggested.



EVALUATION

Overcoming the subject involves attending classes and preparing a group project with audiovisual elements television report about 5 minutes. The score is obtained from the following varemos:

- 1) Note the work group will be prepared for all members thereof and which corresponds to the work presented to the teacher. That note, which responds to the assessment of the final work and continuous evaluation of the process of preparation, equivalent to 75% of the final grade of the student;
- 2) An individual work involves the development of pre-script of a report of 30 minutes free and original theme and representing 20% of the note. The work will contain the following headings:
 - Presentation or written lead (1 minute).
 - Focus topic: addressing basic ideas.
 - List of selected voices (biographic and contact information and questions).
 - Location of shooting scenarios.
 - Treatment of realization: characteristics of the assembly, image effects, graphics, music, etc.
 - The documentation collected shall be accompanied during the preparation of pre-script.

And 3) To pass the course it has to obtain at least 5 points between paragraphs 1 and 2. It is a must to be evaluated have attended and participated in all sessions of teamwork (only one excused absence will be accepted) and delivered within assigned individual work requirement.

2. Workload and teaching schedule

The activity programmed in the classroom is adapted to the non-face-to-face mode, so that the work that had to be done in groups at the TAU facilities is done individually at home using the student's own resources (mobile device and basic editing software). To make this work feasible, students are provided with some materials with the basic instructions necessary to carry out this work through the virtual classroom. Before, they are addressed in the weekly online sessions. To influence these contents, a complementary weekly activity will be scheduled that consists of viewing a television report available on demand from the perspective of the most significant structural elements in the construction of this genre and in the writing of a subsequent comment.

3. Methodology

Classes are taught through a weekly synchronous video-conference through Blackboard Collaborate, in which, in addition to addressing the contents of the subject that are developed in parallel to practical work, there is an open round of interventions to resolve any well-related questions with these contents or with the course work. In addition, a permanent forum will have been set up for any queries related to individual course work, so that questions and answers are shared with all students. In addition, the virtual tutoring email is available for any query that is not related to group work, which will have to be done



through the permanent forum.
