SUMMARY

Descriptive summary of the asignatura:

The subject *Social Projects* combines the knowledge and competences acquired in the subjects belonging to the core subject Social Work: Concepts, Methods, Theories and Application with those acquired during *External Internship I*.



Social Projects provides a general vision of social work in its group and community fields of action, understood as their spaces for intervention. Students gain the necessary pre-professional theoretical and practical knowledge to guide their steps towards new intervention spaces. The term “project” is used to designate the purpose of doing something (goods or services) to satisfy needs or solve problems.

Upon completion of the subject, students will have the theoretical and conceptual skills used for the development of specific competences and their application (for example in *Diagnose and Assessment*, a fourth-year subject).
