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TEACHING METHODOLOGY

A. Ordinary classes.

There are three hours of class activities per week. These hours are distributed this way:

1- Theory classes taught by the professor (30 hours per course)

Theses classes last two hours a week, and there professors will present to the students the main aspects of this subject, trying to systemize the contents and providing the bibliography to the students in order to prepare their exams.

2 - Classroom practices (15 hours per course)

The practical exercises and case study will take place during one hour a week within the class hours. Their aim is to help the student in his or her analysis, comprehension and personal approach to the Valencia artistic event.

B - Attending seminars or complementary activities.

Within this section there is the mandatory attendance of the student to one activity, organized by the professors of the subject, as a visit to an archaeological site, a collection or a museum; the attendance to a conference or a monographic seminary, etc. that will be evaluated according to criteria known by the students before carrying out the activity.

C - Attending to non scheduled tutorials.

Students will be able to assist to the tutorials established by the professors in order to discuss any aspect or doubt regarding the subject.

D - Attending to scheduled tutorials

Students will be able to assist to scheduled tutorials offered by the professors in order to expand some aspects, both theoretical and practical, in scheduled sessions.

EVALUATION

The following items will be assessed:

1. The proper attendance to theoretical and practical lessons. It will be monitored by means of exercises, analyses of examples previously reviewed, involvement in academic discussions, dissertations or tests. 2. The attendance to complementary activities.

3. The final exam. Its purpose is to test theoretical knowledge and its practical implementation. It will be required to achieve a mark of 4/10. Otherwise, it won't be possible to sum it up to the grades that the student could achieve in parts 1 and 2.

The percentages assigned to the former variables are:

Exam: 60-50%

Readings and complementary activities: 30-20%

Individual or collective projects: 20-10%

Regarding the second summons:

The marks of readings, complementary activities and projects obtained in the first call can be kept in the second call. Again, in the exam it will be required to achieve a mark of 4/10.

IN-PERSON / DISTANCE LEARNING

1. Contents

The contents initially included in the teaching guide are maintained.

2. Workload and time schedule

The activities and their hours of dedication in ECTS credits marked in the original course guide will be kept. If the classrooms capacity according to the sanitary norms allows it, the theoretical class attendance will be 100% (if the capacity couldn't be guaranteed, the class attendance would be reduced). Supplementary activities (weekly hour P: total 15 h.) won't have class attendance and will be preferentially online. Teaching planning will be specified at the beginning of the term.

If the sanitary situation changes and no access to the University facilities is possible, all teaching activities will be carried out completely online. In this case, the adaptations will be communicated to the students through the Virtual classroom.

3. Teaching Methodology

Theory and practice classes that may be complemented with different types of materials and activities in the Virtual classroom.

Tutorials will be done online (through the UV corporate mail) or face-to-face by prior appointment with the teacher.

If the sanitary situation changes and no access to the University facilities is possible, teaching and tutorials will be carried out completely online. In this case, the adaptations will be communicated to the students through the Virtual classroom.

4. Evaluation

The evaluation criteria established in the Course Guide are kept.

If the University facilities were closed on the dates set in the official calendar for the final exam, the faceto-face exam will be replaced by an online test.



Supplementary activities will be carried out by students autonomously following the instructor's indications. Reading tests and other kind of assignments could be online through tasks, questionnaires and videoconferences.

5. Bibliographic references

The recommended bibliography in the Course Guide is kept. If the sanitary situation changes and the access to the recommended bibliography is not possible, it will be replaced by online materials.
