TEACHING METHODOLOGY**CLASS ATTENDANCE**

There will be four hours of contact classes throughout the week, ie activity in the usual classroom subject. During these class hours the teacher will present and explain the fundamentals that will guide the student in the study and understanding of different topics. In addition, due to the practical nature of the subject, they will be carried out various activities (identification, reading, location, dating and description of the physical characteristics of the products analyzed written) from the facsimiles which provide the teacher.

EXAM PREPARATION

For the preparation of different subjects, with view to the completion of the review, will be essential to present the theoretical contents explained during classes, additional readings, and especially recommended for each of the topics.

EVALUATION**EXAM**

They will be examined the contents explained in the classroom by the teacher. These contents correspond entirely different agenda items. The exam consist of a written theoretical and practical, according to the content of the test subject. The written exam will take place on the official date set by the Faculty of Geography and History and the score on the same will be the subject.

The review assessed separately theoretical and practical content. To pass the course will obtain at least five (5) in each of the sections.

Excepting Erasmus students, grammar and spelling problems will score negatively on the qualification of all written tests and academic works. Their accumulation may lead to a failing grade in the course.
