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SUMMARY

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La asignatura pertenece al grado de Ciencias Políticas, impartiéndose como obligatoria de tercer curso. La asignatura retoma parte de los conceptos y teorías introducidos en Fundamentos de Ciencia Política I y II, así como los contenidos que se dan en otras asignaturas paralelas, como Comportamiento, Actores y Cultura Política o Sistema Político Español, para profundizar en su desarrollo empírico, haciendo énfasis, sobre todo, en las variaciones prácticas que se dan en diversos países.

El valor específico de esta asignatura se basa en su orientación aplicada y comparada, donde los contenidos se centrarán en el análisis de las tendencias políticas contemporáneas. Para ello se recurrirá a diversos casos comparados, dejando de lado el caso de España, ya tratado en otras asignaturas, y prestando especial atención a la evolución de otros sistemas políticos europeos y no europeos.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

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EVALUATION

The composite grade is based in 2 elements, both in the first and in the second exam periods:

a) A final exam: at the end of the course a final test will be carried out on all the contents of the course, whether they have been taught in the classroom or not. The exam will also include the materials that are included in the different sessions. This test will have a value of up to 60 percent of the overall score. The student must have achieved at least a 4 (out of 10) to add the score of the assignments made in the class along the course.



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b) Assignments in the class: Throughout the semester will be made different exercises and complementary activities of various kinds to be delivered in presence the day of the course (some of them require that the student has previously worked on the materials indicated by the teacher). The content of these exercises in class also constitutes materials and susceptible to be part of the end-of-course test, regardless of whether the student has done and well all the deliveries. The overall score of these exercises will have a value of 40 percent of the final grade (dividing equally (20%) between the two seasons of the course in case of annual subjects).

The non-delivered exercises will not be recoverable later or for the second call.
