SUMMARY

La asignatura pertenece al Grado de Ciencia Política y de la Administración Pública, impartida como obligatoria de tercer curso. La asignatura aplica buena parte de los conceptos y teorías introducidos en Fundamentos de Ciencia Política I y II al caso español. En ella se estudiará el papel que la historia, las instituciones y los diferentes actores políticos y sociales tienen en el funcionamiento del sistema político español. La asignatura no sólo se centrará en el análisis de cada uno de los componentes del sistema político, también y sobre todo pretende introducir a los alumnos a examinar las interacciones que se producen entre los diferentes componentes. Por eso se combina teoría y prácticas que serán, esencialmente, ejercicios de aplicación del conocimiento adquirido.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

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EVALUATION

The composite grade is based in 2 elements, both in the first and in the second exam periods:

a) A final exam: at the end of the course a final test will be carried out on all the contents of the course, whether they have been taught in the classroom or not. The exam will also include the materials that are included in the different sessions. This test will have a value of 60 percent of the overall score. The student must have achieved at least a 4 (out of 10) in order to compute the score of the assignments made in the class along the course.

b) Assignments in the class: Throughout the semester will be made different exercises and complementary activities of various kinds to be delivered in presence the day of the course (some of them require that the student has previously worked on the materials indicated by the teacher). The content of these exercises in class also constitutes materials and susceptible to be part of the end-of-course test, regardless of whether the student has fulfilled (and made correctly) all the deliveries. The overall score of these exercises will have a value of 40 percent of the final grade (dividing equally -20 percent- between



the two seasons of the course in case of annual subjects). The teacher will specify in advance which exercises are evaluable.

The non-delivered exercises will not be recoverable later or for the second call.

ADDENDUM HYBRID TEACHING

Teaching methodology:

In the first semester the teaching will take place in a hybrid format: the students will alternate weekly face-to-face teaching and synchronous teaching. This will affect both the master classes and those of a more practical nature and with continuous evaluation (giving the exercises in person or through 'tasks' in the virtual classroom at the end of the class, according to the week). The teaching staff will teach all the classes of the program in the classroom and it will be the students who take turns, each week, in the face-to-face assistance or synchronous monitoring through the virtual classroom.

The adaptations that are indicated are extended and are directly applicable during the second semester of the 2020-2021 academic year in the event of the contingency of a regrowth and the temporary closure of the classrooms. In matters not provided for in this addendum, the provisions of the teaching guide and the corresponding teacher's annex will apply.

Evaluation system:

The continuous assessment will be carried out as established in the teaching guide, although the students will deliver their practical exercises in person in the classroom (the weeks that they have to attend in



person to class) and through the application of virtual classroom tasks (in alternate weeks, when synchronous monitoring corresponds). The final test at the end of the course will be done in person, as established in the teaching guide, as long as the sanitary conditions do not recommend otherwise.

ADJUSTMENTS OF THE ADDENDUM * COVID FOR THE SECOND SEMESTER ADAPTED TO THE RESOLUTION OF THE RECTOR OF 28 JANUARY 2021 AND TO THE DIRECTORS OF THE FACULTY OF LAW FOR HIS DEGREES

Hybrid teaching:

When required by health conditions, teaching will be adapted to a hybrid format: students will alternate weekly face-to-face teaching and synchronous teaching. This will affect both the master classes and those of a more practical nature and continuous assessment (delivering the exercises in person or through 'tasks' in the virtual classroom at the end of the class, depending on the week). The teachers will teach in the classroom all the classes of the program and will be the students who are alternating, each week, in the face-to-face assistance when appropriate, or alternatively through synchronous monitoring through the virtual classroom and work. autonomous, theoretical or practical, guided and tutored by teachers.

The contents, workload and assessment are maintained in the terms initially provided in the academic guide. Individual or collective tutorials will be developed through institutional mail or through virtual classroom tools; in case of being carried out in person, all safety and hygiene measures will be respected. Complementary activities will preferably be carried out in a non-contact mode through the webinar format.

The final exam of the subject will be face-to-face (always complying with the regulations of gauging and interpersonal distance, for which it will be sequenced in two shifts if necessary), as long as the opposite is not provided by law.

In what is not foreseen in this addendum, the provisions of the teaching guide and the annex of the corresponding teacher will be applied.

Non-contact teaching:

When, in accordance with the instructions of the health and university authorities, the evolution of the pandemic does not allow the subject to be taught in a hybrid teaching model, this subject will be taught in person, applying what is provides in the addendum for this situation.

During the month of February 2021, this non-contact teaching model will be followed, which will be adapted to the provisions of the Rector's Instruction of January 28, 2021 and to the "Adjustments in the document of adaptation of the degrees of the Faculty of Law of the University of Valencia in the second semester of the academic year 2020/2021 due to the health crisis caused by the pandemic by COVID-19 ". This model will be revised and adapted, if necessary, to the instructions received by the * Faculty and by the University depending on the evolution of the circumstances.

In what is not foreseen in this addendum, the provisions of the teaching guide and the annex of the corresponding teacher will be applied.
