## SUMMARY

The course will provide the student tools to understand and apply the cultured norm of Spanish in all its aspects, both at other linguistic levels (morphology, lexicon ...) merely spelling, typography level; It is given, therefore special attention to the misuse of language in its oral and written expression, as established by the last academic regulations.
