4. Unit 4

Grammar: Relative pronouns and relative clauses

Grammar: Third conditional and mixed conditionals; 'wish', 'if only' and 'hope'

AVALUACIÓ

Assessment breakdown for first and second calls.

A) Individual final examination that includes a listening test and a use of English test.	50%
B) Final oral test	30%
C) Activities carried out during the course	20%
Total	100%

To pass the subject students need to get at least 50% as an average of parts A, B and C. Students must also get 50% in each section of part A and a 50% in part B. The mark for the 20% of part C will be carried over to the second call. These activities (part C) can only be done during the course and cannot be handed in for the second call. The mark for these activities (part C) is only counted if the student passes parts A and B.

Assessment Criteria



Students will need to show that they have grasped the concepts introduced by their lecturer(s). They will also have to demonstrate that they have learnt the lexical, grammatical and functional items to be used in the multiple contexts seen in class.

Students will also need to show that they have attained a B2 competence level in and that they have acquired a satisfactory level in the other specific competences.

1. Contents

Contents will remain the same as stated in the official syllabus.

2. Workload and teaching schedule

The weight of the different activities which add up the working hours in ECTS credits is maintained as in the official syllabus.

The sessions have been scheduled on the same dates and times but with a shorter duration. Students will be able to carry out and submit the tasks and activities within longer and more flexible scheduled periods at their convenience.



3. Teaching methodology

- Tutorials via forum and chat on aula virtual, email, and also video conference when needed, scheduled with the student.

4. Assessment

The percentage of the different parts is the same as in the official syllabus:

- A) Use of English test (30% of the final grade), conducted through Aula Virtual and/or the most suitable audiovisual applications.
- B) Oral test (30% of the grade) and listening test (20% of the final grade) via the most suitable audiovisual applications facilitated by the UV.
- C) Activities carried out during the course (20% of the final grade).
