SUMMARY

La asignatura "Comentario de textos literarios en Lengua B" es una asignatura obligatoria de 6 créditos que forma parte de la materia "Estudios en literaturas de lengua italiana" del Maior de Italiano del Grado de Lenguas Modernas y sus Literaturas. Esta materia se compone también de otras asignaturas con las que esta se complementa: "Estudios de narrativa en lengua italiana", "Estudios de teatro y artes del espectáculo en lengua italiana", "Literatura en lengua B y artes audiovisuales" y "Estudios de poesía en lengua italiana", por lo que se ha pensado el temario para que no haya coincidencias con dichas asignaturas sino que sean un complemento.

La asignatura tiene como objetivo principal el dominio de los métodos de comentario a textos literarios de distintos autores y autoras, géneros y épocas.

Desde el punto de vista técnico, se aprenderán los métodos de análisis y comentario de textos. Desde el punto de vista del contenido se centrará en el estudio, análisis y comentario de dos obras fundamentales de la literatura italiana: el *Canzoniere* de Francesco Petrarca y *Orlando Furioso* de Ludovico Ariosto. Se requieren conocimientos de la lengua italiana a nivel A2+ del MCER.

3. Orlando Furioso de Ludovico Ariosto

Presentación de la obra. Antecedentes. Análisis de la estructura.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Theoretical classes: We will begin with an introduction to the theoretical foundations of text commentary before beginning the study and analysis of the works indicated in the syllabus. Afterwards, each of the two topics will begin with a brief theoretical introduction as a context and then move on to analysis and commentary. Practical classes: Students will begin by reading and commenting in class on the beginning of each work and then prepare oral presentations on parts of each work, which will be shared in seminar sessions. Other activities: students will present in class the comments prepared individually on the class readings and those selected by the teacher for each student.

EVALUATION

The subject will be assessed in two parts. 75% will correspond to a final exam, which will consist of two text commentaries: one on a sonnet from the Canzoniere by Francesco Petrarca and one on a fragment of the Orlando Furioso by Ludovico Ariosto. Both commentaries will be based on what has been studied during the course. The other 25% will be obtained through the evaluation of the scheduled oral presentations and the written work resulting from these, which will always be handed in before the official exam date.



The evaluation will consist of 2 different parts:

- a) Final Exam 75%.
- b) Oral presentations and assignments in class 25%.

In order to pass the course as a whole, it is necessary to achieve at least a pass mark in each of the parts.

Assessment criteria

The correct application of the techniques of analysis and commentary studied in each of the three papers submitted will be taken into account. The originality of the analysis, the appropriate use of the bibliography and linguistic correctness will also be taken into account. In the oral presentations of the commentaries, communicative skills and the capacity for synthesis and exposition will also be assessed. Of the competences mentioned above, priority will be given in the assessment to 21 (knowledge and application of the currents and methodologies of literary theory and criticism) and 23 (knowledge of literature or literatures in a foreign language). In all exercises, both oral and written, communicative skills in Italian will be taken into account.
