SUMMARY

Asignatura del Minor de "Lengua portuguesa y sus literaturas" (6 créditos, 4.^o curso, 1.^ocuatrimestre).

Esta asignatura se divide en dos partes:

1) - la primera está destinada a servir de complemento al abordaje iniciado en "Literatura y Cultura en Lengua Portuguesa 1" en los ámbitos histórico y literario:

- a) - En el ámbito histórico se abordarán los principales acontecimientos ocurridos en Portugal a lo largo del siglo XX;
- b) - En el ámbito literario se estudiarán obras de los principales autores y movimientos literarios ocurridos en Portugal entre la segunda mitad del siglo XIX y el siglo XX.

2) -La segunda parte de la asignatura está dedicada a Brasil. Se estudia brevemente su construcción y los fundamentos de su cultura. En esta tiene particular importancia su literatura.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

La docencia presencial consta semanalmente de cuatro sesiones, dos de teoría y dos de práctica oral y escrita que servirán de complemento y refuerzo a las clases teóricas.

Clases teóricas:

Sobre cada uno de los temas del programa, siguiendo el desarrollo puntual especificado para cada uno de ellos en el temario. El profesor expondrá los contenidos esenciales y explicará la forma en que deben ser abordados por el alumno. Se realizarán ejercicios de lectura, comprensión y análisis.

Clases prácticas:

Lectura, explicación, comentario y análisis de los textos históricos y literarios referentes a las épocas, movimientos y autores estudiados, contribuyendo así a la asimilación de las competencias y contenidos referidos.

Otras actividades:

Tutorías

Para resolver dudas que puedan surgir tanto en las clases teóricas como prácticas, así como para orientar en la realización de otras actividades relacionadas con los contenidos del curso.



EVALUATION

La evaluación constará de dos partes diferenciadas:

- a) Examen escrito individual - 80 %
- b) Asistencia y participación - 20%

En caso de no asistir con regularidad a clase, se opta al otro apartado de la evaluación, de modo que la nota final no podrá ser superior a 8.

El examen escrito constará de dos partes:

- 1) - Preguntas de desarrollo sobre los temas y autores explicados en clase;
- 2) - Control de lecturas: preguntas sobre los libros de lectura obligatoria.

Criterios de evaluacion:

Teoría:

- Adquisicion de los conocimientos especificados en el temario.

Práctica:

- Capacidad para leer, interpretar y analizar obras de la literatura estudiada en su lengua original;



- Capacidad para desarrollar por escrito una reflexión crítica y sintética sobre los aspectos de la historia, cultura y literatura estudiadas;
- Refuerzo de las competencias comunicativas en lengua portuguesa.
