SUMMARY

'Italian Literature (2nd Language)' is a basic subject of the subject 'Literature' of the Module 'General Philological Training' of the Minor in Italian. It is also a compulsory subject eligible among various literatures for the Faculty of Philology Degrees.

It is conceived as an introduction to Italian literature for students who have not studied it before. It focuses on the study of authors, works and literary movements representative of 20th century Italian literature.

PREVIOUS KNOWLEDGE

Relationship to other subjects of the same degree

There are no specified enrollment restrictions with other subjects of the curriculum.

Other requirements

This subject is related to the subject Italian Language 1 (2nd L.). No specific prior knowledge is required.

OUTCOMES

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS



- 1. Historical and cultural introduction to the Italian twentieth century.
- 2. The transition to the twentieth century: Gabriele d'Annunzio and The transition to the twentieth century: Gabriele d'Annunzio and decadentist literature.
- 3. Literature before the First World War. The avant-garde and post-Dannunzian poetry. The Crepusculars.
- 4. Literature between the Wars: poetry, narrative and theatre. Italo Svevo. Reading and commentary on Pirandello, "Sei personaggi in cerca di autore".
- 5. The great poets of the century: Saba, Ungaretti, Montale.
- 6. Neorealism. Pavese and Vittorini. The Gadda case. Italo Calvino: Reading and commentary of a book from the trilogy "I nostri antenati".
- 7. Critical intellectuals: Pasolini y Sciascia.
- 8. The 'neoavanguardia'. The 1980s, postmodernism and the end of the century: narrative, poetry and theatre.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Theoretical classes: The course will begin with an introduction to the theoretical foundations of textual commentary before moving on to the study and analysis of the works indicated in the syllabus. Afterwards, each of the topics will begin with a theoretical introduction as a context to then move on to the analysis and commentary of the chosen texts.

Practical classes: Texts will be read and commented on in class, and students will be able to prepare presentations and individual or group work.

EVALUATION

- 1. Attendance and participation: 10% (continuous assessment).
- 2. Written assignments/exercises/readings: 30% (continuous assessment)
- 3. Final exam: 60% (Must be passed in any case. Below 5 no average is made with the rest).

The continuous assessment system requires a minimum attendance of 80% of the classes. Those who, with justification, cannot comply with this requirement, will agree with the teacher at the beginning of the course on an alternative method.

For the 2nd call, points 1 and 2 are considered non-recoverable assessment activities, i.e. they will not be repeated, and the grade of the 1st call, positive or negative, will be maintained. Therefore, only test 3 will be taken.

Other evaluation/correction criteria may be indicated in the virtual classroom.

The general grading system will follow the regulations of the Universitat de València approved by the Consell de Govern on 30 May 2017. ACGUV 108/2017.
