## EVALUATION

The evaluation of the course will have the following modalities:

An oral or written test (to be determined by the professor) consisting of a single theoretical-practical exam that will be equivalent to 70% of the grade. Continuous evaluation of each student, based on regular attendance and active participation in the proposed classroom activities, such as the realization of practices or participation in workshops, the development and / or delivery of work, reports / reports and / or oral presentations on such activities, individually or collectively, all taking into consideration the degree of involvement and effort of the student in the teaching-learning process and the skills and attitudes shown during the development of such activities: 30% of the grade.

The continuous evaluation consists of: Group work: 1 point

Individual work: 1 point (essays, reports, reports).

Workshop: 1 point

Only in the case of passing the global test with a minimum grade of 5 out of 10, the weighting with the continuous evaluation will be carried out.

The grade of the activities passed in the continuous evaluation in the first call will be maintained for the second call. The individual work will be recoverable in the second call.

The faculty responsible for the course may determine in the annex to the teaching guide the possibility of changing the final exam modality when the student is obliged to take the exam on a date other than the official date on which it will be held. on a date other than the official date in application of the rules foreseen for the case of coincidence of exams in the Regulation of Evaluation and Qualification of the Degrees and Master's Degrees of the Universitat de València, or any other cause established by regulation (e.g. justified cases of force majeure). In these cases, the new type of exam to be taken must maintain the same level of demand and difficulty as that of the previous one. the same level of demand and difficulty as the one carried out in general in the rest of the group.

Students who have followed the continuous evaluation and have been evaluated of the same, in the case of not taking the final exam on the official date of examination (both in 1st and 2nd call), will obtain a grade of "No Show". will obtain the grade of "Not Presented".
