SUMMARY

Power and taxation in Medieval Europe is a 3-credit elective course that will examine the foundations of power in medieval society, from feudal monarchy to territorial states of the late Middle Ages, the basis of the so-called modern state. It will be considered on one hand both the political, cultural and institutional elements and the social and material foundations of different public powers, from the monarchy to local communities, through the courts and parliaments. Political and technical personal of each administration and the building of fiscal and financial systems will also be examined, with particular attention to the origins and development of public debt.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Through these courses, teachers will identify and explain those fundamental issues that will guide the student to the study and understanding of the different contents of the subject. Nor shall carry out various practical activities which aim the application of theoretical knowledge acquired. The materials needed for the development of each activity shall be promptly provided by teachers.

PREPARATION OF LECTURES

Readings: For the preparation of lectures and in order to delve into specific aspects of particular importance in relation to the different issues that make up the program, the student will perform various readings. The texts shall be those readings and assessment procedures used in each case shall be referred by teachers.

MODULE WORK

The student will work on a topic relating to any aspect of the issue in the module, once agreed that working with one of the teachers of that module.

PLANNED TUTORIALS

Teachers will meet students in scheduled tutoring to perform academic-personal interviews and / or group counseling, designed to encourage independent student learning through solving specific problems, the review of the literature recommended etc.

EVALUATION

PERFORMING MODULE WORK:

The student will work on a topic relating to any aspect of the issue in the module. The work will be led by a teacher in any of the subjects of the module, who is responsible for the evaluation. Assessment procedures used for each of these activities will be announced in due course by the teachers. The student will present the work to the teacher responsible for the course within the time shown in the table included in the General Information Master students is facilitated.

The work constitutes 80% of the final grade, with the attendance and / or seminars, and active participation in these activities 20% of the final grade. Average will be made only if work has earned a grade of approved (equal or more than 5 out of 10).

WORK OF COURSE

Eventually, announcing the beginning of the teaching of each subject, the teacher can ask for an assessment of the specific readings for each subject. In this case will the overall rating of the module and
