SUMMARY

The subject "Legal framework of companies and entities of the Social Economy" is a subject of Module II "Legal, accounting and fiscal regime of the Social Economy" of the Official Master in Social Economy. The subject defines the legal framework of companies and entities; delimits the various entities that are integrated under this concept, and describes the legal regime of cooperatives, labor companies, associations and foundations, among other. It is an introductory course of the Master that helps to understand the organization and operation of these companies and the sector in which they are developed.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The learning process of the module is structured in a theoretical part and a practical part.

The theoretical part will be developed through master classes supported by the basic and complementary bibliography of each topic and specific reading materials that will be indicated to the student. However, the participation of the student throughout the theoretical sessions will be valued positively; participation that may consist of reflections and personal evaluations of the student about the concepts and theoretical content provided by the teacher. The practical part will be developed through sessions based on the active participation of the students. Practical cases will be presented referring to different legal aspects of Social Economy companies (Cooperatives, Associations, Foundations, etc.) that students must work individually or in groups, preferably in class, and whose reflections must reflect in writing, and where appropriate, expose in class.

EVALUATION

The evaluation system will consist of a continuous evaluation based on the following aspects: Attendance to the theoretical classes and seminars of the module and participation in them (up to 10% of the global mark), reports and practical exercises carried out in class (up to 50%) and final exam (up to 40% of the final mark)). The exam will take place on the official date and will consist of answering several theoretical-practical questions.

The course will be carried out face-to-face, unless sanitary circumstances prevent it. In this case, the teaching and evaluation will be adapted to the guidelines prepared by the University to ensure non-face-to-face teaching.

1. Contents

The contents initially collected in the teaching guide are maintained

2. Volume of work and temporary planning of teaching



Maintenance of the weight of the different activities that add up the hours of dedication in ECTS credits marked in the original teaching guide, and of the Sessions scheduled on the same dates and times with the same duration.

3. Teaching methodology

Materials are uploaded to the Virtual Classroom (agenda, articles, books, exercises, questionnaires, etc.); The class is taught by BBC synchronous videoconference and the tutoring is done by email, by BBC videoconference and through the virtual classroom forum.

4. Evaluation

Continuously evaluable activities are maintained in the original guide. Regarding the final evaluation test, it will be based on an exam containing test questions and theoretical-practical development questions. The exam will work as follows: a questionnaire task will be uploaded to the virtual classroom at the scheduled time for the exam to start. Measures will be taken to individualize the questionnaire: generate different test-type questions in the question bank, configure the appearance of the questions and answers randomly, etc.

5. Bibliography

Much of the bibliography is available through the university's VPN. For the part of the bibliography not available, it is replaced by scientific articles available online, and the teachers prepare their own materials
