SUMMARY

The course aims , through a theoretical and practical , to help students acquire the necessary skills to express themselves with ease , conviction , spontaneity and fluency in the various fields in which it has to make a public presentation or debate an argument content . Specifically , and as a priority , this training will address the act of preparing the public defense of the research Master's thesis and the thesis doctoral.A through learning various specific techniques of communication and expression (bodily , gestural, linguistic , narrative , etc. .) , and use group dynamics to facilitate communication , spontaneity and confidence , will try to overcome the fear of facing an audience and the various communicative deficiencies of each student. This will be studied and exercise the basic presuppositions of discourse and argumentation : structure and organization of ideas , words and phrases to be used , timing , proper emphasis , the importance of gestures , pauses , silences, etc. .

The course has a very practical purpose. To do this, are provided at the end of each unit , a series of oral exercises that students must complete (will be recorded , as far as possible, so they can be examined and make appropriate adjustments .) Similarly, fragments of speeches by various political and cultural personalities of the world , emphasizing its communicative springs and its defects are analyzed.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

The aim of this module is diverse in its content but in its matching purposes. To support the one hand , the search and systematization of documentary sources, as essential for the commencement of an investigation preparatory task . In this task becomes very important efficient use of new technologies, especially the bibliographic management and document databases , as well as the internet itself, since more and more information is in it and not in hardware deposited in libraries . This knowledge is basic to explain what the research method and its different stages, without neglecting attention to the skills and attitudes to be met for a researcher , as well as instruments and suitable for successful research environment. In particular, the choice of subject and director of work will be discussed , it will search and systematization of sources supporting those , but especially to them in person at a library and finally the organization of work will be discussed and efficient use of time.

In turn, this learning must ensure the correct wording of a research and their subsequent communication . Correct understanding and implementation of administrative work required for a research presentation and / or a thesis that must be defended publicly will also be monitored .

All previous knowledge, will be finally implemented the face - served nature of this module, a methodological and transversal workshop on prevention and public awareness on violence against women that is presented as an essential practical addition .
