This course is part of the subject Introduction to professional and research activity in Archaeology, formed by various activities aimed at training students in all aspects related to professional and research work.

This seminar is dedicated to introduce students to different problems, referring to remarkable processes of change in the Western Mediterranean Prehistory, which have sparked discussion among researchers promoting novel methodological developments.

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS

1. Seminar. Processes of change in the Western Mediterranean Prehistory

This course is part of the seminars in which visiting professors or the Master own, present the results of ongoing research projects. Its theme will focus on different aspects of research problems related to prehistoric and archaeological lines

Masters research, so that students are familiar with and can choose from among those that will be further development in his Doctoral Thesis.

Order to guarantee a minimum of variability to facilitate the choice by students of their future thematic work is planned offer five optional seminars, which may vary in some cases between academic courses, which will be chosen 4. 12 credits ECTS.

2. Tutored Work

Work carried out by students under the supervision of a tutor and aims to develop students' skills to face an issue researcher.

The topic will be determined by mutual agreement between students and tutors in the interest of the first. The activity involves an archaeological approach to a topic that is developed from literature sources and / or empirical.

The activity concludes with the preparation of a Power Point presentation



15 minutes, which will be discussed in public session before the rest of the students and teachers.
